Description of Sessions:

Engaging Fathers as Partners:

Strategies for Equity and Impact-Fathers play a critical role in shaping student success, yet their involvement is often underutilized, particularly in underserved communities. This workshop explores research-driven, practical strategies to promote meaningful father engagement in schools. Educators will learn actionable approaches to create inclusive, welcoming environments that empower fathers to participate actively in their child's education, advancing equity and improving outcomes for all students.

Designing Engaging Portfolio Systems that Strengthen Home-School Partnerships

Imagine a portfolio that grows alongside a student — capturing their strengths, dreams, and milestones while also giving families a clear window into their journey. In this session, you'll explore how to design systems where portfolios become more than collections of work: they become tools of connection. We'll look at how districts can align portfolios to their Portrait of a Graduate, invite family voices into the process, and showcase learning in ways that matter to communities. You'll leave with strategies to spark student ownership, strengthen family engagement, and build a shared narrative of growth that supports every learner's path forward.

From Barriers to Bridges: Transforming Family School Partnerships for Student Success

This session is designed for school and district leaders who are committed to advancing equity and student achievement through strategic family engagement. It is especially relevant for principals, assistant principals, and district administrators seeking to strengthen partnerships between families and schools. Participants will leave with leadership-driven strategies to nurture inclusion, empowerment, and shared responsibility in their school communities.

Building Better Family Bonds

This interactive session introduces a four-part workshop series designed to help families grow stronger together. Through hands-on activities focused on communication, forgiveness, gratitude, and teamwork, participants learn practical skills to build trust, resolve conflict, and create a more connected home life. Facilitators will also gain tools to lead engaging, inclusive sessions that support families of all shapes and sizes. Whether you're guiding a group or participating as a family, this session offers meaningful strategies to build better bonds—one conversation, one activity, one breakthrough at a time.

Cultivating Spaces for Engagement and Connection

Participants will experience hands-on activities and guided reflection that demonstrate how to foster trust, amplify family voices, and reduce barriers to participation. From Challenges to Triumphs: Empowering Latino Parents with Practical Solutions

This session equips educators, community leaders, and service providers with effective strategies to support and empower Latino parents. The session emphasizes the importance of offering culturally relevant educational content, recognizing the inherent strengths of Latino families, and guiding parents in advocating for their children's needs within the educational system. By enhancing parental engagement and collaboration, this training aims to promote stronger family-school partnerships and contribute to the overall success and well-being of Latino communities. This session will describe evaluation findings and lessons learned from an initiative in Atlanta that implemented a father engagement program in four elementary schools with primarily Black and Hispanic fathers.

A Kite Without a String: The Cost of Unanchored Leadership

A kite is designed to rise, but only when it's connected. In this reflective session, participants will examine the metaphor of leadership as a kit: bold, elevated and meant to reach great heights but only when held by a guiding string. Leaders who lose connection to their teams, values or community often find themselves tossed by every wind of change, trend or ego.

Connecting for Student Success: Tools for Your Tool Box

Inspired Conversations Transforming Family Engagement from Transactional to Transformational

What if the most transformational family engagement strategy isn't a new app, flyer, or checklist—but a meaningful conversation?

This session introduces Inspired Conversations, a reflective, relationship-centered framework grounded in the book *Inspire Me Moments: Living Out Loud with No Regrets*. Led by educator and author Anthony Harris Brown, this session explores how authentic engagement that is rooted in trust, cultural responsiveness, and lived experience, can transform school-family dynamics.

Participants will explore storytelling as a leadership tool, reframe events from transactional to transformational, and consider how fathers, male caregivers, and underrepresented voices can be

intentionally centered in the family-school partnership. Backed by real CMSD data, field-tested tools, and the Dual Capacity-Building Framework, this session invites educators to reimagine engagement as a powerful bridge between school, home, and community.

Whether you support family partnerships, school culture, or student success, you'll leave this session re-energized and equipped to design family engagement experiences that uplift voice, value, and visibility.

Crack the Code: Leveraging Data to Engage, Elevate and Empower Parents

Unlock the power of parent engagement with Crack the Code: Leveraging Data to Engage, Elevate, and Empower. In this interactive session, participants will learn how to use simple, meaningful data to better understand families, strengthen school-home connections, and support student success. Whether you're new to data or looking for fresh ideas, this workshop will provide practical tools, real-world examples, and a friendly approach to making data work for you. Walk away feeling confident, inspired, and ready to engage parents in powerful new ways.

Panel Discussion: School-Based Father Engagement (SBFE) – Changing the Narrative of Family Engagement

Too often, schools unintentionally overlook fathers and father figures in their family engagement strategies. Yet research consistently shows that when dads are welcomed and intentionally invited into schools, student success, classroom climate, and teacher morale improve.

This panel brings together leaders from nationally recognized School-Based Father Engagement (SBFE) programs. Panelists will share strategies, successes, and lessons learned from the field. Together, they will explore how SBFE strengthens family-school partnerships, supports Title I compliance, aligns with MTSS Tier 1 practices, and builds a more inclusive school culture for every child.

While SBFE may be a new name, these programs have been strengthening school communities for well over 20 years. They enrich the lives of children with active fathers and provide important role models for students who may not have a dad at home. Unlike traditional "fatherhood" or "mentoring" programs, SBFEs are rooted in the school setting, designed to support academic success through direct family-school partnership, and inclusive of all families. The panel will outline what sets SBFE apart and why it matters for today's schools.

I Don't Do Math: Family Engagement Debunks the Myth

I Don't Do Math: Debunking the Myth' workshop is designed to empower educators with research-backed strategies for engaging parents in their children's STEM education (K-12). Many parents believe they lack the necessary skills to support their children in math and science. However,

Enhancing Family and Community Engagement through the Four Agreements

Description of Sessions:

The Art of De-escalating Adults in the Educational Environment

They will be able to discuss strategies and compare ideologies regarding supporting angry stakeholders. We'll explore the power of intentionally learning and using names to build connections, discovering individual needs through authentic conversations, nurturing those needs with empathy and support, and equipping students and families with the tools to navigate challenges effectively. This session will empower participants to cultivate a sense of belonging, collaboration, and purposeful engagement within the family and community to increase student success. Whether you're a teacher, leader or community partner, this session will equip you with practical tools, reflective insight and a renewed commitment to engage with purpose. Come ready to transform how you connect with those you serve, from the inside out!

Building a Welcoming Environment for Multicultural and English Learning Families

The session will highlight the importance of cultural humility, ongoing staff training, and collaborative partnerships with families to break down systemic barriers.
